TWENTY-FIVE YEARS AGO--

(January 13, 1919)

Mrs. Collison, wife of Archdeacon Collison of Kincolith, is dead. She and her husband came to this coast as missionaries for the Church of England shortly after their marriage in 1873. Mrs. Collison served as a nurse on the battlefields in the Franco-Prussian war, and rendered valuable service as a medical mission among the Haida and Tsimshian Indians.

A new school room was opened in the Hays building Second Avenue. The school board decided to rent the room for \$35 a month and equip with temporary furniture. "In the past the ruling has been brute force; in the future it will be character." This was the message of the Rev. S. A. Crux speaking before St. Andrew's Society.
