#### Soldiers Our Own Boys . . .

Most students of human behavior will decline to be alarmed at the dire predictions of a New York agent of the FBI that a returning army of millions of men, trained in the technique of killing, will create new problems in crime prevention. Soldiers have not turned criminals or killers when they returned from former wars.

Our boys in this war have been trained to take human life only in the last two or three years. They were not professional soldiers. Neither were they like the Nazi youth, brought up from childhood with their minds closed to all the accepted virtues and open only to the fierce, pi'iless emotions of their false and narrow philosophy. British and Americans still retain the kindliness, tolerance, sympathy—yes. respect for human life-developed in youth. Most of them will return to their old ways.

Moreover, some who might have become criminals in "normal circumstances" are more likely to have been indoctrinated in the Army with respect for law and order. They might even become police-


