NOTTINGHAM, Eng., March 1 (AP)—Two Nottingham sisters are to be the brides of two almsmen, a Canadian and an American, at a double wedding here in the spring.  
Miss Eileen Stevenson and Miss Kathleen Stevenson, both war workers, two of the four daughters of Mr. and Mrs. W. J. Stevenson, have simultaneously announced their engagements to P.O. Charles Usher, D.F.C., of Vancouver, and Lieut. Lloyd E. Daley, of Los Angeles. Eileen, who is 22, met P.O. Usher at a dance in a Nottingham ballroom six months ago. "We had a good time and at a Christmas party given by our parents for United Nations Servicemen he popped the question," she told a reporter.  
Kathleen is 18, and met her bridegroom-to-be three months ago.

### Postwar Houses Being Developed

LONDON, March 1 (AP)—Ten British housewives will be the guinea pigs in an experiment to evolve the British home of the future.  
Work has started on 10 houses on the outskirts of London which will embody labor saving design and modern equipment unheard of in the average English home.  
When the buildings are completed 10 housewives with their families chosen by the Ministry of Health will inspect, and probably live in the houses for a period. Then they will criticize and suggest improvements. On their verdict will depend the construction of 4,500,000 homes which Britain hopes to provide for her population in the next 10 years.

### Aussie Mothers Won't Go Native

CANBERRA, March 1 (AP)—Two Australian mothers, the aboriginal and the koala, carry their babies on their backs.  
Perhaps this idea was in the mind of the Department of War Organization when, faced with a shortage of basic materials for prams, it evolved plans for a carrier for white mothers like a soldier's pack in which the child could lie down or sit up.  
But the mothers turned it down cold so the department succeeded in developing substitute materials for prams and in simplifying and standardizing types.

### Express Delivery For Official Mail

New Service Links London With Middle East and the Antipodes.

LONDON, March 1 (AP)—An express letter delivery service which links London with service stations throughout the Middle East and thence to Africa, India, Australia and New Zealand, has been set up by the British military authorities.

Controlled by the Royal Corps of Signals, it conveys urgent secret and other official documents which could not be sent through the ordinary army post office. Through a network of communications by road, rail, sea and air close and constant.

contact between all branches of the service is assured. A certain amount of R.A.F. and naval mail is also handled.  
The hub of the organization in the Middle East is in Cairo.  
Private mail is banned, but occasionally suspicious-looking parcels are opened, and recently the sorters found some squash racquet balls in one parcel and a couple of bottles of whisky in another. Other "finds" have in-

cluded women's silk stocking and lingerie.  
About 200 men, working a day-and-night service, handle an average of 9,000 letters and parcels daily. Short-distance letters are delivered in Egypt by fast trucks which cover more than 2,000 miles daily and by dispatch riders.  
Aircraft are used for the service to the west, to Malia, Italy, Gibraltar, and England, to the

north they fly to Beirut and Aleppo, east and south to air routes to Athens, New Zealand. These connections to Russia and South America.
