Hon. Herbert Greenfield (U.F.A.), Aug. 13, 1921, to Nov. 23, 1925.
Hon. John E. Brownlee (U.F.A.), Nov. 23, 1925, to July 19, 1934.
Hon. Richard G. Reid (U.F.A.), July 19, 1934, to Sept. 3, 1935.

Hon. Ernest C. Manning (S.C.), May 31, 1943, to present.
*Hon. William Aberhart died May 23, 1943.
