the East. Europe is ablaze with the war of liberation. We now await the destruction of Hitlerism, the greatest menace to world civilization. Behind those who fight our battles abroad we must mobilize our greatest strength and national unity to win the victory in war and to lay the foundation for lasting democratic peace."

The immediate struggle was not between capitalism and socialism, else Great Britain and United States would not be allied and fighting side by side with Russia, but between democracy and the Hitler policy of world conquest. Gone were the Fascist appeasement principles of Munich and instead was the declaration of Teheran on plans to win the war and the aims of the post-war period. While striving for the establishment of socialist principles, it must be recognized that capitalism was here for some time to come so it would be necessary for capitalism and socialism to co-operate. There could not be two wars—one at the front and one at home—as suggested by Harold Winch. Unity at home was essential to victory abroad and the establishment of a lasting peace along democratic lines. The speaker warned against elements who would permit of a negotiated peace.

There were, however, Mr. Mickleburgh admitted, elements that were working for national unity even in the C. C. F. He also admitted that there had been some constructive legislation at the recent session of the Legislature such as the increasing of old age pension and the strengthening of the position of organized labor.

The speaker referred to Canada's great and important war effort on behalf of the struggle for democracy. Post-war conditions could be such, he suggested, as to permit of social security through full employment in production of goods the world would need, great public works and rehabilitation measures.

CAPITALISM AND SOCIALISM BOTH It must be admitted that people of this country still had capitalistic tendencies, even if they professed socialism, and it was misleading to suggest that complete socialism could be made effective immediately after the war. Labor, however, must be accepted in full partnership to the best advantage and the permanent, lasting peace secured. Unity of the progressive elements of all groups must be secured.

The speaker saw danger in emphasizing at this time the issue between free enterprise and socialism. The people of Prince Rupert like people throughout the country should unite in full effort to eliminate Hitlerism and usher in peaceful and orderly progress along truly democratic lines.

Charles Vizer was chairman of the meeting. Alex Gillanders, Labor-Progressive Party literature director, spoke briefly. A collection was taken up by Mrs. Alex Gomex and Mrs. J. R. Blakey amounting to \$21.41.
