**Gibraltar May Lift Obstacles**


GIBRALTAR, Feb. 23. (6)—The ban on married couples living in Gibraltar, imposed when Italy entered the war, may soon be lifted, if negotiations, now under way in London, are completed.

Recently when an army dental surgeon married a Wren the officer was transferred two days later, and although his transport vessel stayed in the harbor a week, he wasn't allowed to go ashore and his wife could only shout at him from a small boat alongside.


