VICTORY LOAN PICTURE HERE

Novel Screen Contribution to Coming Campaign Is Seen at Capitol Theatre This Weekend.

A featurette of novel and timely interest is being shown on the picture program at the Capitol Theatre here this Friday and Saturday in "The Shining Future," a picture made at Hollywood by the entire moving picture industry on behalf of the Canadian Motion Picture War Services Committee in support of the forthcoming Sixth Victory Loan campaign.

Herbert Marshall is the announcer of the picture which is a Hollywood view of the year 1960 as depicted in the modest home of a family of that day. The members of the family are Charles Ruggles, Olive Blakeney and Jimmy Lyndon. The boy insists on scrapping the old helicopter for a new "rocket ship." The parents are reminded of the war days of 1944 and the boy turns on a reversoscope to get a radio program of that era. By this means Bing Crosby, Deanna Durbin, Frank Sinatra, Cary Grant, Harry James, Irene Manning, Dennis Morgan and others are brought to the screen. Then the Great Gildersleeve (Harold Peary) arrives at the door and offers to pay his debts, his explanation of how he obtained the money to do so providing an amusing and topical climax.
