That people should be prepared to accept Christ and his teachings without too much practical explanation was the Easter morning message of Rev. A. F. MacSween at First Presbyterian Church yesterday. Christ stood waiting for admission to the hearts of men and it would be well in these days if His doctrines were accepted, the minister asserted. As at other churches of the city, First Presbyterian had a large congregation. The minister was assisted by Captain E. Walker, chaplain of an Ontario regiment, the personnel of which had had a service in First Presbyterian Church earlier in the day. The children of the Sunday School joined with the adult congregation for the morning service and the junior choir, under the direction of Mrs. E. J. Smith, the organist, sang the anthem, "Risen a Glorious King." Another feature of the morning service was the presentation of perfect attendance certificates to Barbara Teng, Barbara Flaten, Viola May Prendegast and Jean Calderwood. The beautiful floral decorations of the church were in honor of the memory of the late James G. Steen.

The Easter subject was carried into the evening service when the pastor preached an appropriate sermon and Senior choir sang "Christ Our Passover."

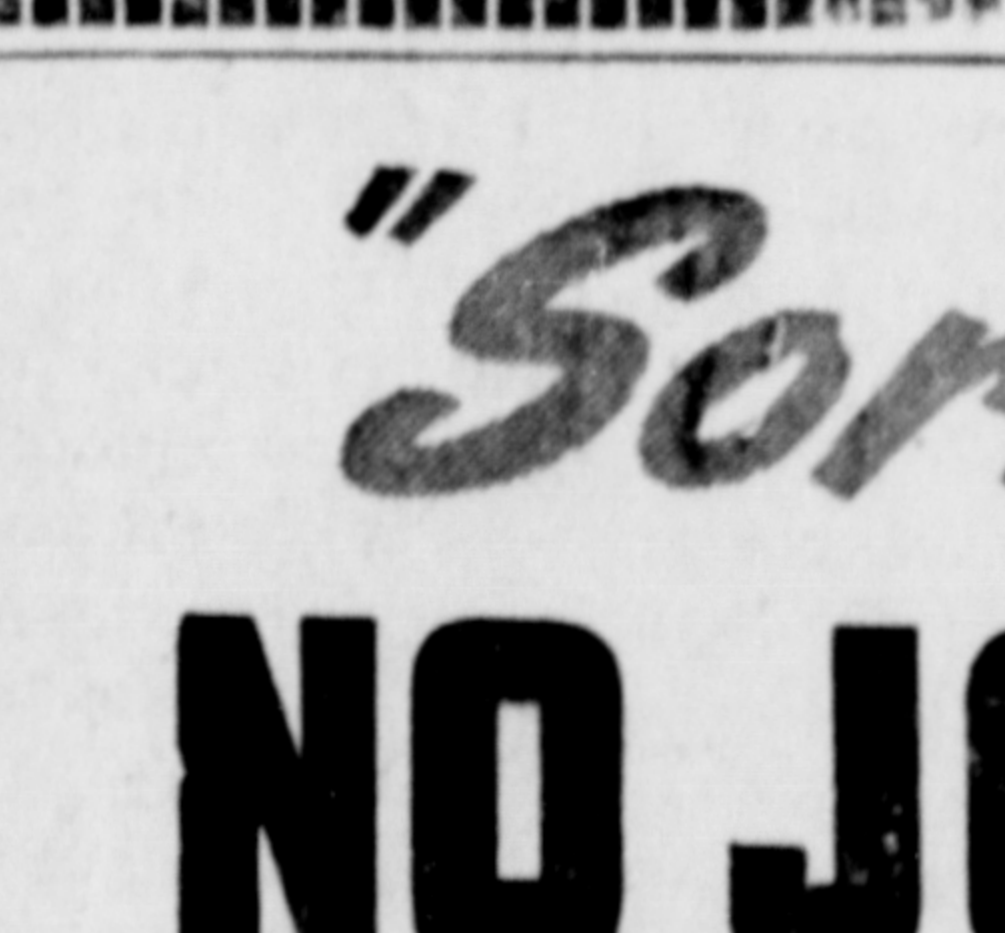



Terrace Vets Name Delegate

Will Attend Conventions at Vancouver, Taking Resolutions With Him.

TERRACE, April 10—The Canadian Legion, at a meeting on Wednesday evening in the new hall on Lakeside Avenue, when business was mostly of a routine character, named a delegate to represent Terrace Branch of the Legion at the forthcoming conventions of the Provincial and Dominion Commands to be held in Vancouver, the delegate being S. E. Anderson. Credentials will be supplied to Mr. Anderson and he will present two important resolutions, one asking for better treatment of the so-called burnt out veterans and the other calling for the deportation of the Japs.

Although there have been rumors of an increase in the pension awarded to veterans under the Soldiers' Allowance Act, there has been no official notification and it is felt that the present twenty dollars a month is inadequate. The resolution asks that this be increased to a dollar per day and that the widow of such a soldier be provided with a pension of this amount for the rest of her life.

Undersecretary Of State Pays Britain Visit

LONDON, April 10 — Edward Stettinius Jr., Undersecretary of State for the United States, has arrived in London for important discussions on international matters affecting the two countries. Mr. Stettinius came over in place of Secretary of State Cordell Hull who could not make the trip at this time. Accompanied by John G. Winant, United States Ambassador to Britain, Mr. Stettinius spent part of the week-end with Prime Minister Winston Churchill and will confer with Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden this week.
