



Approximately three and a half hours after the outbreak of fire the engineers had been returned to the ship and put on enough steam to proceed at two knots. later increasing to six.

The difficulties of the rescue were far from over. Because most of her bridge and superstructure had been burned away. the tanker was without wheelhouse and compass and was steering from below. The Canadian coryette thus assumed the role of a "seeing-eye dog" for the stricken ship and after two days of tiring vigil led her safely into port.

When the captain saw land he exclaimed: "Thank God, we are safe." His cargo was virtually intact. Only 600 tons of fuel had been lost. His crew was so grateful to the Canadians that they tossed over their life-jackets as souvenirs.

Lt. Ferguson was loud in his praise of the tanker's spirit. "They deserve all the credit," he said. "As an old merchant service man, it was a pleasure to give them a helping hand. Because they refused to give up, 57 of the 58 men in that crew will live to sail again."

Officers of the Hepatica, in ddition to Lt. Ferguson and Lt. Wilson, include Lt. W. G. Leonard, R.C.N.V.R., Toronto; Chief Skipper Garland Vatcher, R.C. N.R., Halifax; Lt. Pierre Desaulles, R.C.N.V.R., Montreal; and Sub. Lt. D. B. Douglas, R.C.N. V.R., Winnipeg. Every province in Canada is represented in the ship's company.




