She had received 448,584 gar-

nearly half the total amount of
garments received from over-
seas.

Christian Church Needed to Bring World to Order

From the day of the Pentecost,
anniversary of which it was, the
Christian Church had been ap-
pointed the executive agency of
God in the world and its great
task today was to capture the
power necessary to restore peace
and justice among the nations,
declared Rev. Captain R. G.
Fraytag of Orange, New Jersey,
United States Army chaplain, in
a sermon at morning service in
First Presbyterian Church yester-
day. To begin there must be
the regeneration of the individ-
ual from sin and selfishness,
the firing of the hearts of men
with the spirit of Christ. Unfor-

tunately, there was abun-
dantly evidence today of the power
of Satan as a Prince of the world.
The expression of ideal
principles was a weak
thing but there must be
more than the expression. There
must be action and man's sup-
port of the church and the prin-
ciple for which it stood must be
active and a united support.
Captain Fraytag was speak-
ing at First Presbyterian Church
in the absence of the pastor,
Rev. A. F. MacSween, who
was away to attend General As-
sembly in Toronto. Flight Lieut.
J. A. Koffend, Royal Canadian
Air Force chaplain, who
preached last night. Others
who have undertaken to assist in
the pulpit during Mr. MacSween's
absence are Capt. W. D. Douglas,
and Rev. E. L. Douglas, Canadian
Navy.
