# n the Night of January 19th 1944...

Corporal Harold Bradley Leppard was one of a patrol sent out to locate enemy positions on his regiment's front in Italy.



The patrol located an enemy post of unknown strength. Cpl. Leppard set out with the patrol commander to obtain a prisoner, leaving the rest of the patrol in observation.



The two managed to get within 5 yards of the post undetected-then rushed it. A machine gun opened up on them and wounded Cpl. Leppard in the stomach and twice in the arm.



Although severely wounded, Cpl. Leppard killed the German manning the machine gun and one other with his machine carbine. This enabled the patrol commander to overpower and capture the third member of the post.
