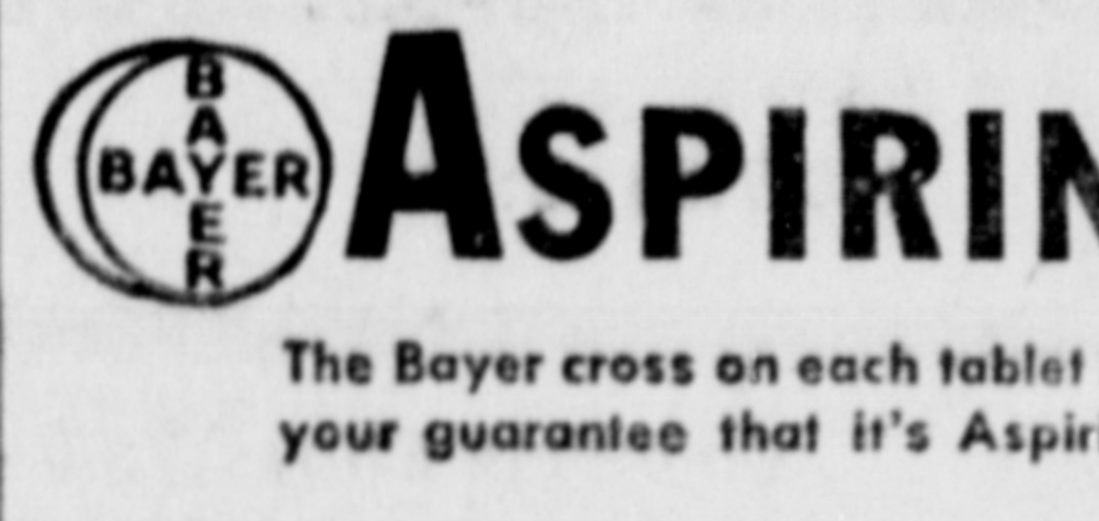

Plans are under way for a bowling league and, in the mean time, the Young People are making use of the U.S.O. alleys each Friday evening.

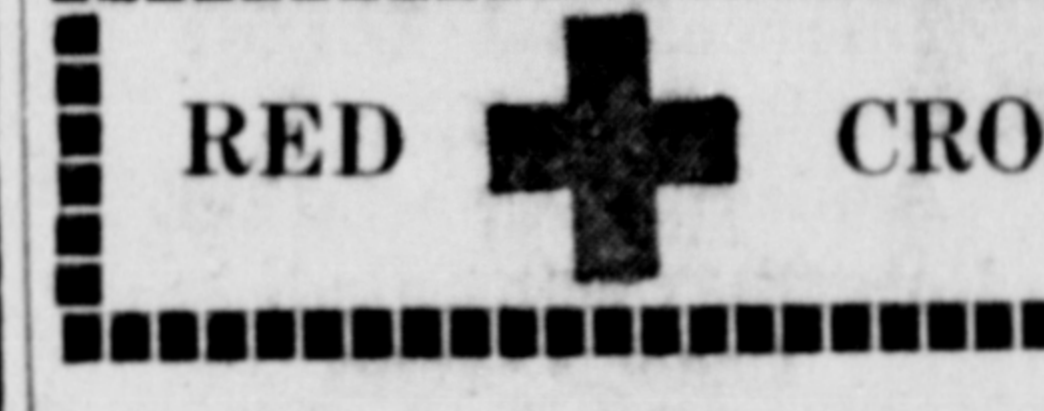
