PROVINCIAL HIGHWAY
(Continued from Page 1)

have a modern highway along its entire length from Victoria to Menzies Bay and Port Alberni, with the necessary feeders where the economy of the district requires it. This is provided for.

(B) The southern section of the Province will be covered by the Hope-Princeton Highway—long promised in the past, now by this Government to become an accomplished fact. This will mean a new "passage" so to speak from Hope to Princeton over the Skagit Bluffs—and from there on through Hedley, Keremeos to Kaldon Corner, where it will link with the main Southern Transprovincial to the Kootenays. The section from Hope to Princeton has been entirely in the hands of the Federal Government for the duration of the war. It is at this point that they have used a good deal of Japanese labor, although few are now being used as most of them have been transferred to production enterprises. Their object was to put a tote road through for purely military purposes. The road has not been made for commerce or tourist traffic and no one should now attempt to use it for that purpose. It will be a very costly undertaking—estimated at some two and one half million dollars—but the result, I am sure, will be well worth it. It will "serve to bring" the great wealth of the Okanagan to the Coast in much less time than is now possible and will be of immense value from an economic viewpoint. It should be understood that when this work is undertaken we do not propose to open the road to traffic until it is fully completed, and then it will allow us to divert all Okanagan traffic that way for a period long enough for us to undertake major developments along the Fraser Canyon route.

As far as a tourist road is concerned it will give a circuit route of inestimable value—allowing visitors to come via that route and return through the scenic Fraser Canyon or vice versa.

Between Vancouver and the Crows Nest we have ten entrances into the United States. At each of these points the American roads come to our doors with magnificent highways all that could be desired—when they cross the Border the situation on our side is far from good. We propose to modernize all these entrances so that when our friends and visitors come to us or our people go to them we can be as equals. It should always be remembered that a good highway acts as the show window of the Province to those coming in from the outside.

Through Interior To Prince Rupert

"Up through the historic Cariboo Road and on into the North to Prince George and east to the Alberta Boundary, and west to Prince Rupert of that Central British Columbia point, the same program must be extended if we are to have a system of network of highways that are not only to be a credit to us but of economic value to the province as a whole."
