PRINCE GEORGE
Hottest weather of the season 93-5 degrees was experienced at Prince George on Wednesday. Forest fires flared up in a 600-acre area southeast of Clucuz Lake and have since become more serious.

It is estimated that construction work will begin by autumn on 25 houses under a government plan whereby homes may be built on loans up 90 per cent of their value by Prince George residents.

Judge Eric Woodburn presided over the most northerly court session in the province recently when at Lower Post, within a stone's throw of the Yukon border, he dismissed Leo Cormier of a charge of receiving and possessing stolen property belonging to the United States government.

Africans Honor English Nurse

LONDON, July 25 (A)—A funeral salute usually given on the death of a great African chief was accorded English nurse, Edith Shelley of Lincolnshire, in Tanganyika recently.

The story of Edith Shelley reads like a novel of heroic self-sacrifice. Since 1923 she devoted her life to missionary nursing among the lepers of Africa.

At first her medical interests were general, but in 1930 when she herself contracted leprosy and the disease was arrested she resolved to devote her life and slight fortune to the curing of others with the same disease. From that time, chiefly by bicycle, carrying her belongings in a kit bag on her back, she travelled the jungle, until a few weeks before a malignant growth caused her death.
