gion which show the effect of forty years of hard work, Mrs. Wm. Clark whose husband, the late Billy Clark, came in to the Bulkeley Valley in 1899, Bob Nelson and family of Wistaria, Jimmy Brewer, Silver Kelly, the well known construction freighter, Charley D. Haven, at the mention of whose name an ovation was given by the "whole crowd," Tom Allen of Colleymount, the Cassidys of the same place, Bill Harrison and his sons, their wives and children, Shorty Matson the bull-puncher, the Jeffrey family of Francois Lake, The Petersons of Francois and the Uncha Valley.

The toast to Sam Cocker, the irrepressible politician from the Nechako brought all the diners to their feet and caused Mike Tuohy, the Walt Whitman of the interior, to break into impromptu verse "He spoke about construction days with easy, fluent grace, and history and politics each had a separate place." Mike responded to the toast in his honor with a brief speech and a recitation dedicated to Catalan and the trail packers who blazed the trail from the Cariboo Road to various points in Central and Northern B. C. which was well received.

The announcement that the Young Rangers parade was about to start prevented anything but brief mention being made of many of the old pioneers who were unable to be present but they were not forgotten.
