**IS GLUTTON FOR ACTION**

Londoner Tells Tall Yarn of His Search for Germans on Italian Front

WITH THE 8TH ARMY IN ITALY, July 28.—We met Peter Grainger poking around Cassino, the grimy, solid personification of the British Tommy. People had been coming to Cassino for days just to look upon its ruins and Peter had come because it seemed like an interesting thing to do.

His regiment didn't know where he was, Peter said. He had left it before the great Italian offensive had started because it was in reserve. He had put his rifle over his shoulder and gone out to find himself a battalion that would cross the Rapido river and fight for a bridgehead. He had gone across the river with the assault waves of one unit, had left it, too, when it went into reserve and had gone on with another.

When he came back to Cassino he was carrying a German machine gun and he had killed one German with it and captured two more.

All this Peter said. "Some people think I'm mad for doing things like this," he grinned. "But that's just the way I am."

Weeks after, we still don't know whether we should regard Peter Grainger of London, England, as the fightingest or the most mendacious Tommy of them all. But we thought we'd tell you about him anyway.

All along the road the Germans had abandoned vehicles. The Allied bombs, shells and bullets had ruined them or started a ruin the Germans finished before they left them behind as blackened, distorted skeletons. There were trucks and buses and cars like the one they had tricked and bullied from Pietro and Giuseppe back in Rome.

There were many more than Pietro and Giuseppe who had been tricked and bullied back in Rome. Three days before they fled the Germans spread through the city the report that those who brought out their cars could have petrol to run them again. Slowly, dubiously the Romans brought out their cars.

Then the Germans struck. They set up machine guns in the streets and grabbed off one vehicle after another. And that is how Giuseppe's car and Pietro's car came to be charred wrecks along the road the Germans took in flight.
