## Cutting Off the Water . . .

It is not only a matter of much inconvenience to have the city's water supply shut off but it might prove to be a very serious thing. In connection with the chlorination of the city's water, regarding the necessity for which we are still very much in doubt, the supply was cut off for several hours Sunday night. Even with the keeping of 200,000 gallons reserve in the reservoir against the possible requirements for emergency such as fighting of fire, we can but speculate on what might happen if a bad fire did break out while the water was off.

If Prince Rupert's water supply is to be interfered with the least that should be done is to give citizens better and longer notice of their intentions than was the case at the week-end. It would be just as easy to give that notice in the newspapers the day previous instead of sending out emergency messages over the radio on a peaceful Sunday evening when the level of the water in the reservoir became alarmingly low.



## ROTARY IDEALS EMPHASIZED

The Rotary Club ideal of "service before self" was emphasized by Very Rev. J. B. Gibson, dean of St. Andrew's Cathedral, at the weekly Rotary luncheon meeting Thursday afternoon when he officiated at the initiation of 10 new members.

Dean Gibson told the initiates that the inspiring motive of Rotary membership was fellowship which went beyond mere friendliness to others of attractive personality.

"It is easy and natural to be friendly with those who appeal to us but the Rotary idea is to be friendly with others in spite of their shortcomings," the Dean said.

He added that the vitality of the club depended on contributions of energy and talent by its members.

Accepted into membership of the club at the brief ceremony were: E. V. Whiting, David Henderson, Bruce Stevens, Crawford Moore, John McLeod, George Dybhavn, C. A. Berner, Frank Howarth and J. K. McLeod.

Another feature of the meeting were autobiographical talks by E. V. Whiting and Crawford Moore. Mr. Whiting humorously outlined his experiences as a newspaperman in Australia, a rancher in southern British Columbia and later positions with the B. C. and federal governments.

Mr. Moore told of the events and business experiences which preceded his coming to Prince Rupert as a timber broker.

Bond sales of \$25,150 Thursday brought the Prince Rupert Seventh Victory Loan campaign total to \$827,950 — 115 per cent above the \$725,000 quota.

Figures for the Sixth Loan last spring show that with two days still to go the campaign was \$110,000 short of its \$750,000 objective. The corresponding day's sales were \$59,256, and the campaign total was \$642,350.




