Those people who go strictly by the form sheet rather than legendary portents are not so sanguine in these hopes. But those who like a touch of the mystic in their racing have noted the green shoots of tulips and daffodils on the gypsy boy's grave just four miles out of town. That is enough for them.

Legend has it that when this grassy mound at the Kennet cross roads on the highway to Bury St. Edmunds produces blooms a horse trained at Newmarket will win the Derby. Furthere, there have been many occasions when the forecast of the grave has lived up to local legend and beaten any readings of public form. Two years ago, it may be remembered. Big Game com Wiltshire was a hot favorite. The grave was a mass of blooms, however and Newmarket folk-some of them at leastremained quite unperturbed by all the fancy flung at Big Game. Came racing day and their faith that bloomed on the gypsy's grave was justified for Lord Derby's Watling Street, a Newmarket horse, won the Derby. Last year there were no blooms. An Epsom horse, Straight Deal, won the race.

The story is that the grave is that of a shepherd bey who watched his sheep in this area a century and a half or so Igo. One day a sheep was missing and, fearing of the consequences when his employer, a local farmer learned of this, he took ha own life. As was the custom of the day when a man took his own life, the boy's body was carried to the cross roads and bursigns of being cared for and some years it produces blooms some years it doesn't and some years Newmarket horses win the Derby and some years they Nobody in Newmarket seems to know who cares for the grave. Always it is trim and neat. Gypsies generally are credited with this good work but nobody in the neighborhood, beyond claiming they do not look after the grave, can say for sure.
