

minster club refused to play  
there because the St. Catharines  
rink is open air. Later, the game  
was re-scheduled for Maple Leaf  
Gardens in Toronto but that in  
turn brought an objection from  
the St. Catharines club.

### NEW TYPE OF LOCOMOTIVE

MONTREAL, Oct. 13 — R. C.  
Vaughan, chairman and presi-  
dent, Canadian National Rail-  
ways, yesterday accepted deliv-  
ery of a new mountain type loco-  
motive as it came out of the  
Montreal Locomotive Works Ltd.  
It was the first of an order for  
20 new locomotives, the remain-  
der to be delivered at the rate of  
one or two per week.

This class of motive power was  
designed primarily for fast pas-  
senger service and will be as-  
signed to runs in various parts  
of Canada.

This Canadian National type  
of locomotive is the nearest look-  
ing iron horse to be designed for  
service in Canada, according to  
the builders.

Since the start of the war, to  
maintain its fleet of motive  
power on a desirable basis of  
efficiency, the C.N.R. has re-  
ceived to date 91 new steam loco-  
motives for service in Canada  
and 25 steam and 30 diesel loco-  
motives for operation in the U.  
S. A.

Several new features are in-  
cluded in the latest locomotive.  
Of semi-streamlined appearance  
it has a completely new face,  
composed of a conical nose  
which contains the headlight  
and number lamps; a radiator  
which is encased behind a neat  
grillage equipped with shutters  
for cooling the air used in the  
brake system, and a flared top  
smoke stack similar to those  
used in the British Isles. The bel-  
has been moved forward and is  
now located right up front above  
the conical nose. A deep skirt  
plate on the running board  
sweeps from the steps at front  
end to the cab, offering an un-  
broken line front to rear.

Finished in Canadian National  
green and black with gold strip-  
ping, aluminum painted handrails  
and brass plates, the engine  
gives an impression of speed.
