tion came closer last night with
the receipt of information that
the Wartime Prices and Trade
Board has no objection to the

vice. The aldermen agreed speed-
ily to the suggestion by Mayor
Daggett that he and City Clerk
H. D. Thain be empowered to
amend the existing bylaw to al-
low an increase in collection
rates.
