Changechun Objective
Closing On Capital Of Manchuria
CHUNGKING, Nov. 27 (P) — All roads lead to Changechun, capital of Manchuria, or so it would seem for all dispatches coming out of China feature the name in stories of the struggle for Manchuria. One of the latest dispatches from Chungking quotes a Chinese Catholic newspaper, Social Welfare, as saying the Russians have placed an additional 20 thousand troops in Changechun for the purpose of maintaining peace and order.
At the same time, Chinese Nationalist armies are reported speeding toward the city in order to be in time to take over when the Russians evacuate. Competing in this race are the Chinese Communists. Strong Communist forces are already reported on the outskirts of the city and some may be inside the city walls.
The Chinese Catholic newspaper report said that the Chinese Reds have been permitted to operate radio stations at Changechun and that they have taken over six of the seven Chinese newspapers. According to this report, they are also said to have nominated a new mayor for Changechun, although he has as yet not taken office.

Council Approves Bylaws for Vote
Final approval of three bylaws which will be voted on by property owners in the form of plebiscites at the civic elections on December 13 was passed by City Council in special meeting last night. They were:
1. A bylaw granting tax exemption to the federal government owned fishermen's floats built on waterfront block "G" and to those in process of construction in waterfront blocks "A" and "B". It would exempt the floats from both property taxes and local improvement taxes.
2. A bylaw to grant title of lot 17, block 20, section 1, (the lot adjoining the present Canadian Legion building) to Prince Rupert branch, Canadian Legion, for Legion purposes for the nominal sum of \$1.
3. A bylaw exempting from general taxes, but not from local improvement taxes lot 17, block 20, section 1, for as long as it is used by the Canadian Legion for its regular purposes.

16-Ounce Bread Loaf to Be Law
The "staff of life" got a bit of reinforcement last night when City Council indicated its intention to enforce the city bylaw governing the weight of bread loaves sold in the city after the first of the year. The bylaw calls for a 16-ounce loaf. Some bread, particularly imported loaves, fall considerably to measure up to the 16-ounce weight, the aldermen were informed.

Another well-known Prince Rupert boy is back in the city after seeing a lot of war action. He is Earl Brochu, who went overseas soon after his enlistment in 1942 and, serving with the Royal Canadian Army Service Corps in the First Division, was through the campaigns of North Africa, Sicily, Italy and then around to Western Europe to finish up in Holland. A truck driver, he sustained a slight injury from shrapnel in the back of the head in Italy. Just discharged but still wearing uniform, he is happy indeed to be home and is looking forward to settling down to civilian life. He returned from overseas about six weeks ago and has been in Vancouver, coming from there on Sunday night. After a few days here, he plans to leave for the south to locate. Son of the late George Brochu, a pioneer of Prince Rupert, his mother is now at Sidney, Vancouver Island.


