ATLANTIC CITY, N.J., April 25. (P)-Hank Borowy, the New York Yankees' top pitcher in victories and in earned runs permitted last season, is looking forward to his best year in the American League. And it's not because he's fooling around with a knuckle ball. True, Hank is working on the pitch, but he says he may not use it in a league game all season. Hank is the sort of guy who won't attempt anything unless he can perfect it. He matriculated at Fordham where he compiled a record of 23 straight victories in two ecasons before blowing a 5-4 decision. But the reason that Hank thinks he'll surpass his 17 conquests of last season is his health. He says he's in the best shape of his six-year career-three with Newark, three with the Yanks.
