### Punishing War Criminals . . .

Since there are so many loyal Norwegians living in Prince Rupert, an exceptional and direct interest was taken in the trial of the arch traitor, Vidkun Quisling, who was found guilty of treason in Oslo yesterday and condemned to death. The verdict met with eminent satisfaction and the hope is that there will be a minimum of delay in carrying out the expiation.

The fate of Quisling will, no doubt, be that also of such war criminals as Herman Goering, Joachim von Ribbentrop, Rudolf Hess and the others.

Japan also has her list of war criminals—possibly more diabolical

and fiendish than those of the Nazi brand. The Allied world awaits speedy action in their punishment.

### Importance of Pacific . . .

To many Eastern Canadians, the Pacific was long a little-known world. But, once and for all, the shock of Pacific war has driven home the fact that Canada is not only an Atlantic power, but a Pacific power as well.

In war, we have seen how small the Pacific has grown. Sydney and Vladivostok, Shanghai and Prince Rupert—each has learned that in mutual trust alone lies safety; the other way lies sub-atomic destruction.

Shaken to its foundations, the Pacific world has paid a fearful price. But against its common front, the aggressor has struck his last wild blows in vain.

In the peace that follows, Canadians have great duties to discharge, commensurate with the Pacific power they have come to be. Increasingly, their eyes are turning westward. For in British Columbia we have a gateway to Asia, a passport to the new Pacific world.



1. Keep lamps and bulbs free from dust...  
Clean them frequently with a damp cloth, removing bulbs and reflector bowls before washing or cleaning.

2. Use light shades...  
Dark shades or ones which have turned yellow inside deprive you of precious light adding up to as much as 50%. Brush shades weekly to remove dust.

3. Place lamps where they will be most useful...  
It isn't necessary to have a lamp for each person, but place each light so that everyone can benefit equally. Avoid glare or dark corners that cause sharp contrasts.
