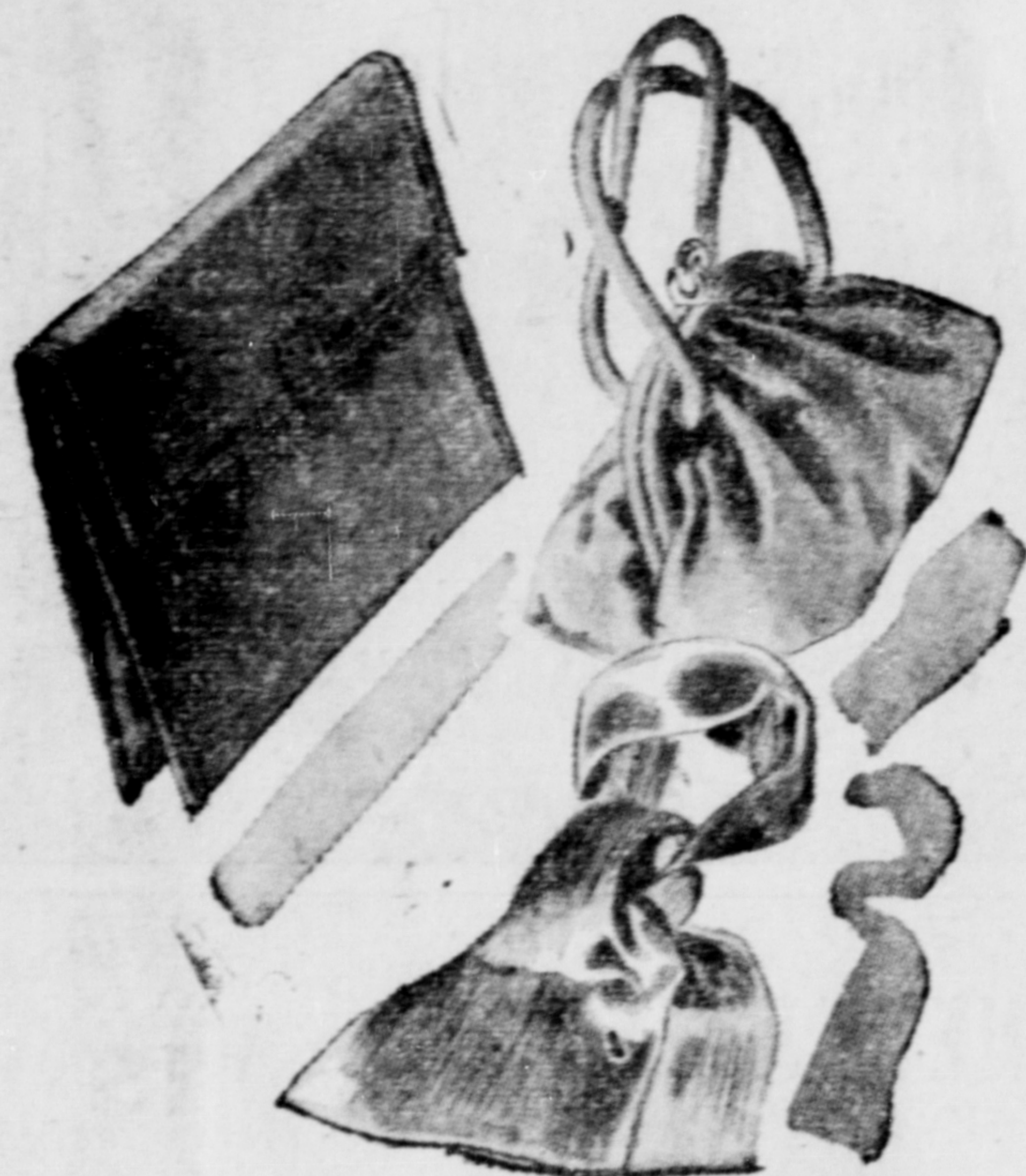

TORONTO, Aug. 3 (C)—The first surprise in the initial round of the \$10,000 Canadian Open yesterday was when Vic Ghezzi of Atlantic City drove in with a two-under par 68 to share the top berth in the play with Miracle Man Byron Nelson of Toledo, Ohio.

Ghezzi formerly was a sergeant in the Allied Fifth Army in Italy.

Third place went to Willie Goggi of White Plains, New York, while Ed Furgol of Itica, New York, came fourth.

Tied for fifth spot were Vancouver's Stan Leonard, Jimmy Hines of Chicago, Herman Barron of White Plains, New York, and amateur Freddie Haas of New Orleans. They all had seventy-two's.

With seventy-three's were defending champion Craig Wood of New York and Harold "Jug" McSpaul. Others with seventy-threes were Virgil Shreeve of Millbrae, California; Joe Zardard of Morrisston; Dock Borthwick of Toronto and Len Harman of Knowlton, Quebec.
