Tomorrow Prince Rupert will once again honor her brave dead in the observance of the annual Decoration Day with a parade to the cenotaph for the placing of a wreath by the municipal regent of the Imperial Order Daughters of the Empire, and with attendant ceremonies at Fairview at the Soldiers' Plot.

Queen Mary Chapter, Imperial Order Daughters of the Empire, has charge of arrangements, with the Canadian Legion cooperating and with the assistance of the area commander, Col. C. C. Ferris, and resident military units. Members of the four local I.O.D.E. chapters, the Canadian Legion and Women's Auxiliary, veterans of all wars, nursing sisters, city dignitaries and such representatives of local organizations as may desire to be present will gather at the Legion Building.
