Interesting Aviary to Be Found in Shawatlans Valley Where Noble Wild Birds Abound

On the higher slopes back of Woodworth Lake, many of the six feet. noble birds known as ptarmigan are to be found. Changing the color of their raiment to meet; the seasons, soon, with the first fall of snow, they will be adopting a motif of white.

In the valley between Woodworth and Shawatlans Lakes, other wonders of bird life are to be found for here lives W. Reginald Coles, bird fancier and destroyer of game enemies. "Reg" helps to protect the water and power supply coming into Prince Rupert and, when patrolling the large pipeline between the lakes, he often totes along his trusty .303 rifle. Actual photos show that many a wolf has rued the day he viewed this rifle from the wrong end.

On entering the front room of this gentleman's house, one is greeted by some half-dozen parakeets (love-birds) or, to use their native Australian name, 'Budgerigars."
