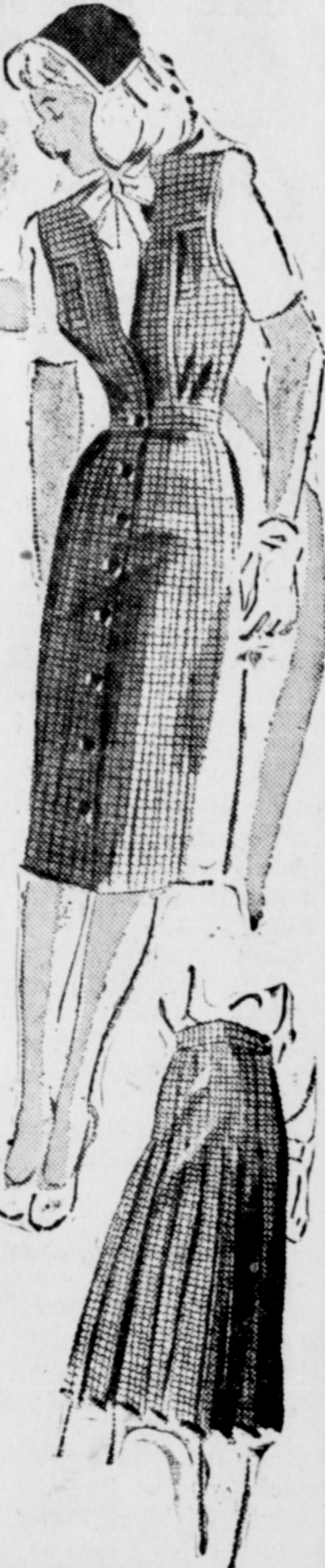

BISHOP BUNOZ DIES

dog sled and snowshoe, in the handling of all of which he was adept himself.

The hazardous risks of some of these journeys was illustrated some twelve or fifteen years ago when his own life was endangered and his travelling companion, Father E. Allard, was drowned in the capsizing of an Indian canoe in flood waters of the Dease River. This was but one of many exciting experiences which Bishop Bunoz had as a missionary priest in his visitations to the remote Indian settlements, the lonely trappers and the isolated prospectors.

Milestones in Bishop's Career

1916—Inviting the Sisters of St. Joseph of Toronto to come and open a convent and parochial school in Prince Rupert.

1917—Inviting Sisters of the Holy Child to come and open a boarding school for Indian children at Fort St. James.

1922—Building of fine new residential school for Indian children at Lejac, Fraser Lake, to which Sisters of the Holy Child moved from Fort St. James.

1933—Obtaining the services of the Sisters of St. Ann for the new Bulkley Valley District Hospital at Smithers.

1940—Inviting the Sisters of Providence from St. Paul's Hospital in Vancouver to come and build a hospital in Vanderhoof which hospital was soon constructed and in operation.

Advancement naturally came to Father Bunoz and on June 13, 1917, he was appointed by the Holy See as titular Bishop of Tentyris and the first Vicar Apostolic of the Yukon and Prince Rupert, the consecration by Archbishop Timothy Casey taking place in Vancouver in the fall.

In 1936 Bishop Bunoz was given a coadjutor in the person of Bishop J. L. Coudert. In February 1944, the vicariate of the Yukon and Prince Rupert was divided in two and the Fort St. John and Dawson Creek sections of the Peace River Block were added to the southern or Prince Rupert vicariate over which Bishop Bunoz presided.

On two occasions in recent years Bishop Bunoz' parishioners paid him high honor of esteem and affection with the celebration in April, 1941, of the golden jubilee of his ordination and the observance in October, 1942, of the twenty-fifth anniversary of his consecration as bishop.

Bishop Bunoz was the real ecclesiastical pioneer of the vast wildernesses of Northern B.C. and the Yukon, was a familiar figure for nearly half a century along the trails and streams. There were no facilities of modern travel—rail, road, steamer or aircraft—in those early days but, a man of great vigor, physique, energy and Godly spirit, he carried the message of Christ to the outposts of civilization by the primitive methods of canoe, horseback,

various parts of British Columbia and Alaska and by the clergy of the Vicariate of Prince Rupert, interment will take place on Thursday in the Catholic section of Fairview cemetery here. Commencing today at noon, the body will lie in state in episcopal robes in the chapel of the rectory where the people may go to view the remains. On Wednesday afternoon there will be solemn office for the dead in the Church of the Annunciation, which was Bishop Bunoz cathedral. On Thursday morning the solemn requiem funeral mass will take place prior to interment.

Bishop Coudert, now in Vancouver, will arrive here Wednesday morning. Archbishop W. M. Duke of Vancouver has also been sent for and other bishops who may come include Cody of Victoria, Jennings of Kamloops and Fitzgerald of Alaska.

The clergy of the vicariate who will be here to participate in the final rite will include Fathers Godfrey and Leray of Smithers, Frey of Terrace, Donze of New Hazelton, Murie of Burns Lake, Simpson and Doherty of Lejac, Marsigny of Babine, Pagnon of Vanderhoof, Gilhooly of Prince George, Bossi of McBride, Hattrick of Fort St. James and Langtagne, Carroll and Racette of Prince Rupert. Father Fleming, United States Army; Father DeKayser, Canadian Army, and Lockwood, Canadian Navy, will also attend.

On Election Day, Canadian voters will be called upon to decide not merely what party they want in office but whether to change our entire system of Government. The decision will be tremendously far reaching and will affect the destiny of this country for years . . . if not for generations.

Employers have the opportunity, if not the actual responsibility, of helping their employees to post themselves on this issue of "State Socialism" . . . so that their verdict at the polls will be based on knowledge and conviction, rather than prejudice or mere discontent.

Someone has said: "We greatly overestimate the knowledge of the masses, but greatly underestimate their intelligence." We assume that people know what it is all about when they do not.
