#### City Won't Use Army Workshop

The Canadian Army workshop at Second Ave. and First St. is ideally constructed for use as a repair shop for city mechanical equipment but it is situated on property too valuable for such i a purpose, city council decided last night.

"It is a good building and would suit our purpose but it is on a valuable corner lot which should not be used by the city," Alderman McKay said in discussing a finance committee recommendation that the matter be discussed further by council.

"That corner of the city is going to be built up and the city would lose plenty in taxes on the property if it was retained for civic use." Alderman Mc-Kay added. The other aldermen agreed with Alderman McKay.




