**Problem Is Raised**

RESIGNS TODAY

Announcement was made today by B. Thorsteinsson, chairman of the Union Board of Health, that Dr. Roger Knipe had resigned as director of the public health unit effective Sept. 1. Dr. Knipe plans on entering private practice at Langley Prairie in the Fraser Valley and may later return to public health work.

Dr. Roger Knipe Asks Leave Of Absence

How to deal with an application from Dr. R. G. Knipe for six months leave of absence from his duties as director of the Princed Rupert Public Health Unit and affiliated public health positions caused perplexity among members of the Union Board of Health at a special meeting in the Mayor's office last night. The application also inspired consideration on the part of city council, meeting in committee of the whole, when it was submitted to that civic body shortly before the Union Board of Health meeting.

Dr. Knipe asked six months leave of absence, beginning September 1, to gain experience in private practice in the south. Although he gave no assurance that he would return at the end of that period, Dr. Knipe indicated his willingness to carry on "in absentia" as head of the local public health department.

He gave as his major reason for wanting leave the fact that his work as head of the Health Unit was largely administrative and that he was gaining little professional experience at it.

"The Health Unit is well organized and ordinarily requires only an administrator to run it. I feel that I could broaden my usefulness by gaining experience in private practice," Dr. Knipe explained.

He said that Dr. W. S. Kerin had expressed his willingness to act as part time director. Dr. Kerin, who appeared at the meeting at the request of the Union Board of Health, agreed that he felt sure that he could handle the part time directorship of the Health Unit as well as his own private practice.

Major stumbling block in the way of granting leave to Dr. Knipe was the fact that his application carried no assurance that he would return at the end of the period.

Alderman Norah E. Arnold, representative of city council on the Union Board of Health, said that city council feared that it might establish an embarrassing precedent if Dr. Knipe were granted leave without any assurance of his return.

"If any other city official tried to take another position and keep his original one open for his return we wouldn't grant it," Alderman Arnold declared.

Dr. Knipe denied that he was trying to leave his position open in case he decided to return.

Board members officially expressed themselves as unwilling to grant Dr. Knipe leave of absence without receiving assurance that he would return and also went on record as being willing to grant him leave if assurance were given that he would return.

"We are trying to administer the city carefully, and one doctor moving out would mean one doctor less in the city," Alderman George Hills, a member of city council's health committee, commented.

Mrs. MacSween is survived by her husband, who is minister of a Presbyterian church in Winnipeg, and two sons, also ministers. They are Rev. Alex MacSween of Princed Rupert and Rev. Ian MacSween of Sylvan Lake, Alberta.
