"DRUNKARDS MATCH"

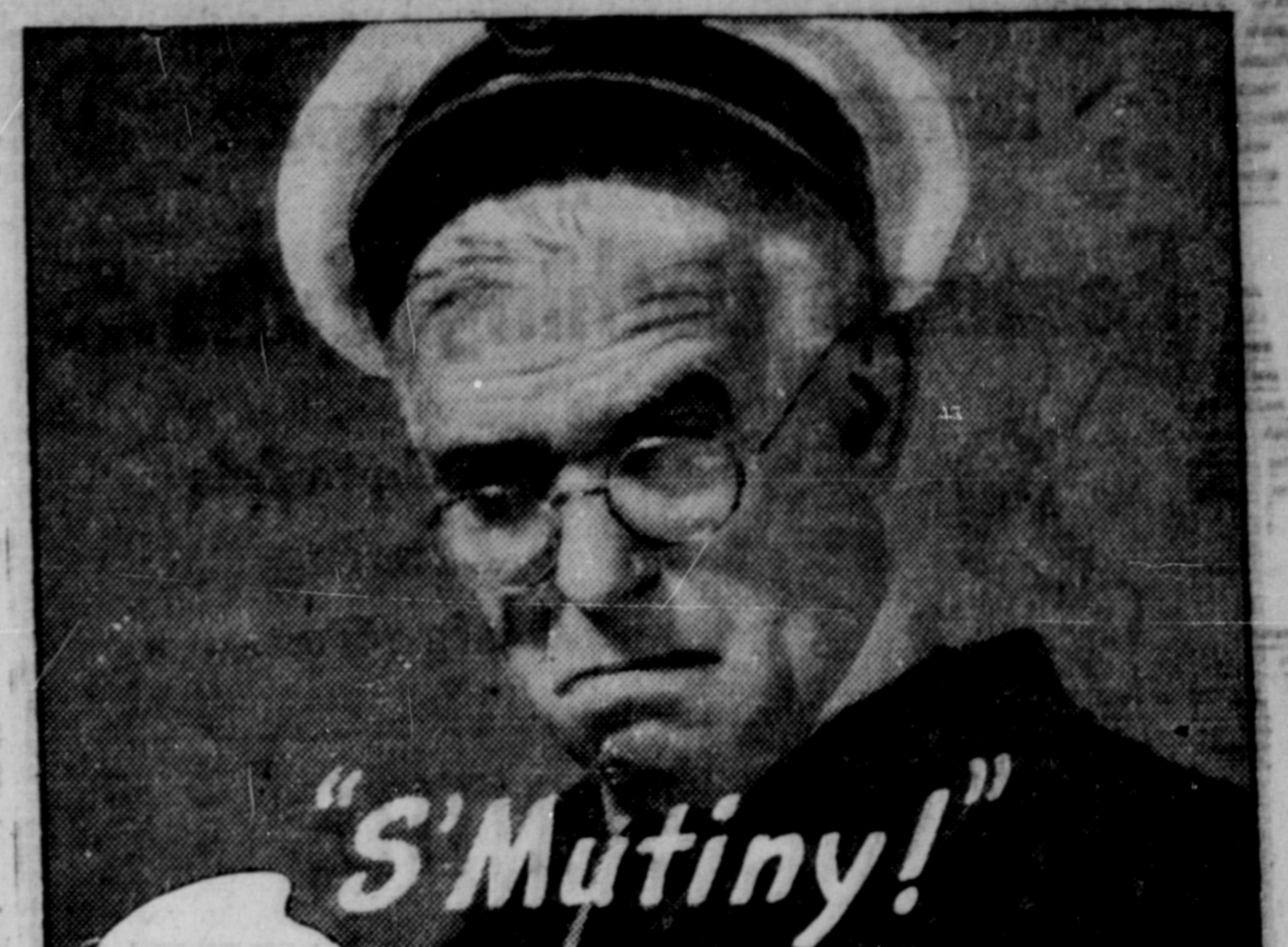
