Tangier Agreement . . .

The Paris agreement for the reestablishment of the international status of Tangier is the first joint diplomatic act of the major Allies in the post-war era, apart from their relations with enemy countries. The agreement is the precursor of the application of the United Nations Charter in the spirit of which it is conceived. It is an example of the cooperation of the Great Powers which is a condition of the success of the United Nations Organization to maintain international peace and security.

The situation created by Spain under the cover of the Allies' war preoccupations is liquidated. The treaty rights violated by General Franco's unilateral action are restored. The powers which now recover the full exercise of those treaty rights include Holland, Belgium and two ex-neutrals, Sweden and Portugal.



Abolition of Control Commodities Urged

HALIFAX, Sept. 13 (P) - The Halifax Board of Trade has gone on record as favoring discontinuance of government-controlled allocation of commodities, especially rubber and wool, and resumption of competitive international buying as early as possible.

An eloquent sermon by Most Rev. Francis Carroll, Bishop of Calgary, featured the initial solemn pontifical mass to be celebrated at his Pro-cathedral of the Annunciation this morning by the newly elected bishop and vicar apostolic of Prince Rupert, Most Rev. Anthony Jordan. There was a large congregation and Roman Catholic clergy from various parts of the vicariate participated. The Metropolitan of British Columbia, Archbishop W. M.
