the diocese, in pairs, then proceeded to the throne to kiss the bishop's ring.

Installation speaker was archbishop Duke who commenced by paying tribute to the memory of the late Bishop Bunoz. The present occasion of great joy and spiritual happiness was the culmination of the conferring of consecration which had occurred at the town of St. Albert, north of Edmonton, last Saturday with the Cardinal conducting the raising of the new bishop to episcopacy.

"With his honors will also go many difficulties," the Arch-

bishop reminded his listeners. "May God grant to this young and vigorous priest His grace and blessing in his new responsibilities."

Reply of New Bishop

Bishop Jrdan, in his reply to sentiments the letters of fealty and welcome from clergy and laity, expressed his appreciation for the sentiments contained therein. He reminded his priests of their duty of continuing the glorious work of disseminating the gospel in the inspiring spirit and example of their oblate predecessors. To the people of the parish he gave thanks for the welcome accorded. He could but pray that, in the fulfilment of the duties lying ahead, God would give him strength, wisdom and courage such had

characterized his noble predecessor in office. "With the support of my clergy and parishioners, may we go forward together in working towards the attainment of God's noble ends."

Father Scannell of Ottawa, provincial of the Oblates of Mary Immaculate, acted as deacon for the installation service with Father Joseph Allard of The Pas as sub-deacon. Father James Sullivan of St. Augustine's Church, Vancouver, was chaplain to Archbishop Duke. Father J. J. Fleming of the United States Army was chaplain to Bishop M. M. Johnston of Nelson while Bishop Francis Patrick Carroll of Calgary was attended by Father J. J. Kennedy of the Canadian Army.

Altar boys for the service were George Gillis, thurifer; Edward Cloutier, bookbearer; Bernard DeJong, processional cross carrier; Gordon Sharun and Ken-

neth Bourgeault, acolytes; Larry Moore, staff bearer, and Darrell Young, mitre bearer.

The choir was under the direction of the Sisters of St. Joseph. Father W. F. Lantagne was tenor soloist and Miss Frances Moore was organist.
