
Cream butter; add sugar slowly; add egg yolks which have been beaten until thick; add flavoring. Sift together flour and baking powder; add alternately with milk to first mixture. Bake in two 7" greased layer-cake pans at 375°F. for 20-25 minutes.

SUGARLESS ICING CHOCOLATE FROSTING: 1 egg white; ½ cup Maple Syrup; ½ tsp. salt; ½ cup Cocoa; ½ tsp.

Put egg white, maple syrup and salt in top of double boiler over boiling water and beat with rotary beater for 9 minutes. Remove from heat and fold in cocoa gradually, blending well. Add vanilla and spread over cake. MADE IN CANADA
