CHRISTIANITY ONLY HOPE FOR ASIA'S WOMEN

Modern civilization must necessarily bind the nations of the world together but this will never take place unless women are allowed to rise and stand alongside men, Prof. Basil Mathews told an audience of women in St. Paul's Lutheran Church Thursday afternoon.

Speaking on the topic of "Future of the Women of Asia," Prof. Mathews saw the future of Asiatic womanhood inextricably bound to the Christian religion which alone offers them the chance to rise.

"Only in Jesus," he said, "is woman placed on an equal basis with man. Only in Christ are they co-equal children of God Jesus defined that and in teaching and practice he made woman the equal of man."

The attitudes of the Asiatic religions toward women were outlined by Dr. Mathews. Hinduism, he said, held women down by child marriages and seclusion while Buddhism set as its goal detachment from human relationships. Woman, he said, is the principal obstacle to the goal of Buddhism, which consequently has no message for women.

Both Confucianism and Mohammedanism stand for the subordination of women, allowing no place for independence. Examples of the results of the economic power of Christianity were shown by an everlengthening list of European women who have become outstanding leaders in community and national life in Asia, Prof. Mathews said.
