




ARMOURED TRAIN ENGINE DISGUISED AS BOX CAR



ONE of the best known diesel O locomotives in Canada—the 9000 of the Canadian National Railwayshas just been discharged from military service. On the secret list since shortly after the start of the war, the 9000 had been completely remodelled in the railway's Transcona shops to furnish the power for an armoured train. These shops also converted four all-steel Canadian National flat cars and three all-steel box cars for this train, which was used in British Columbia until the Japanese invasion menace disappeared. The locomotive was covered with armour plate and camouflaged to look like a box car, making it difficult for the enemy to to spot it in case of attack.
