BRISTOL, April 21 (CP) — Prime Minister Winston Churchill said today that a "new leap forward, a new lifting of body and soul would be required to defeat Japan and bring the Pacific war to conclusion altogether free from any doubt."

In Bristol to present University of Bristol honors, the Prime Minister declared "we have no intention of encouraging any festivities of thanksgiving until we are assured from military commanders that the task is so far complete that everyone may cheer."

He said "world organization which we must build and shall build will be free and open to all nations of the world." He added that there must always be the necessary force to retain aggression.
