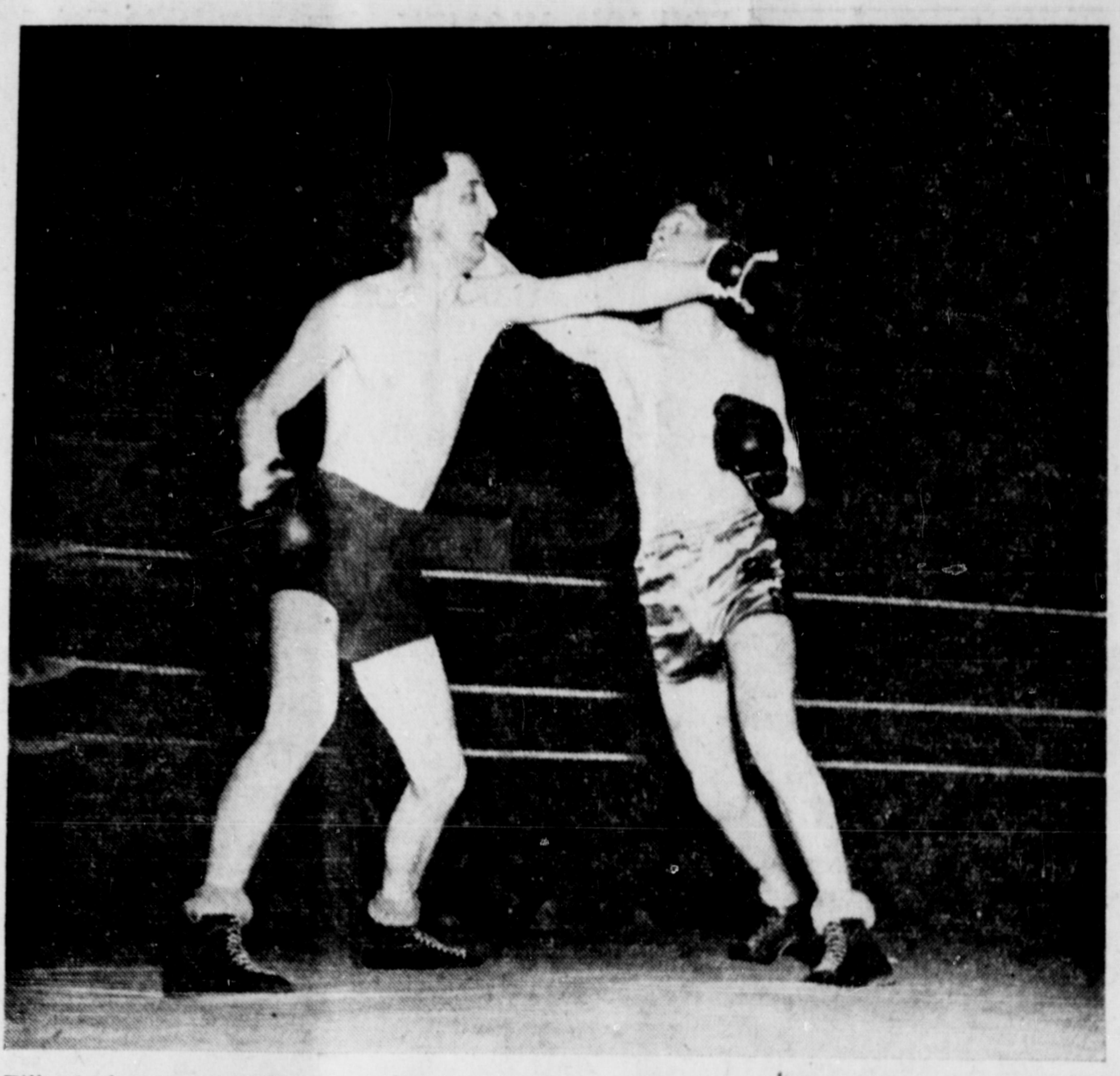

RED SOX' CRONIN BREAKS LEG AT SEASON'S START

Fate dealt the Boston Red Sox a pair of cruel blows Thursday to cap their disastrous opening series with New York at Yankee Stadium.

Joe Cronin, Boston's ancient playing-manager broke his leg running from first to second base in the seventh inning, and to complete the picture, the bean-town relief hurler, Mike Ryba, hit Lindell with a pitched ball in the ninth with bases loaded to give the Yanks a 4-3 win. It was the New Yorkers' third straight victory over the Red Sox.

Big Al Benton, recently discharged from the army, held the Browns to four hits as the Detroit Tigers gained a 1-0 triumph at St. Louis.

Single by Mayo, York and Cramer in the ninth frame off Nelson Potter gave the Tigers the decision.

A home run by George Case in the twelfth inning gave Washington Senators a 4-3 win over the Athletics at Philadelphia.

"Chick" Pieretti, Pacific Coast League rookie, went the distance for the Senators on the hillcock.

Blasting four moundmen for 17 hits, Chicago White Sox swamped the Indians 14-6 at Cleveland.

In the National League, Max Butcher limited the Reds to four safeties as Pittsburgh Pirates scored a 5-1 win at Cincinnati.

An error in the eighth deprived Butcher of a shut-out.

The Braves and Giants shared the first double-header of the season.

VANCOUVER, April 21 (P)—John Riddington, 77, former librarian of the University of B. C., and a noted newspaperman, died last night. He was appointed university librarian in 1914, and retired five years ago.

In 1928 he was president of the Canadian Library Association. He was one-time editor of the Carberry, Manitoba, News, and special editorial writer for the Winnipeg Free Press and until recently was a special writer for the Vancouver News Herald.
