May 24—No coupons become valid.

May 31—Butter, coupon 108.

All previous coupons in Ration Book No. 5 valid until otherwise declared.

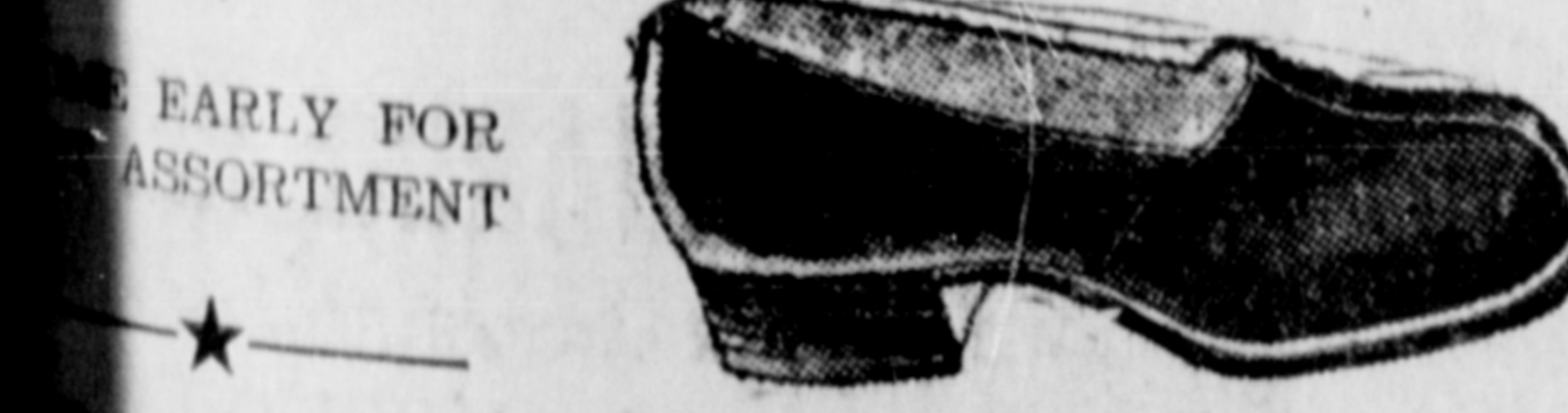
