

The question of the ownership of the Prince Rupert-Terrace Highway cannot be finally settled until the matter of the right-of-way has been permanently arranged with the Canadian National Railways, the provincial minister of public works, Mr. Anscomb, has stated. Until such time as that is done the responsibility for maintenance of the road can be neither placed or assumed. So we know now that the matter which we must immediately press for is to get the question of the right-of-way settled with the railway company. Therefore, the responsibility for the upkeep can be bandied between the two governments either of which, if they choose to do so, could repudiate the responsibility. Meantime, we might consider ourselves fortunate that the provincial department is giving the road the attention that it is getting. A measure of credit is due in that regard.




