

CHILD DIES IN SHALLOW WATER

A two-year old Metlakatla child died of suffocation on the waterfront near her home late yesterday afternoon after she had apparently fallen on her face in a few inches of water while playing at the water's edge with another tiny companion. The child was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Nelson of Metlakatla.

According to a police report the child was found lying face downward in the water, and when efforts to revive it failed, a boat was sent to the city to bring medical he'p. Dr. J. A. Macdonald and J. A. Findlay of the Indian Department were taken to Metlakatla on the P.M.L. 15, arriving about 5:30. However, the child did not respond to treat-
