STORM TIED

BUFFALO, New York ()-Major Kelly of Buffalo proclaimed a state of emergency last night as one of the worst storms in the city's history veered off to the south. Kelly ordered all schools and most city offices closed, suspended the city court, limited the use of telephones to leave all available lines open for emergency calls, and requested Buffalo residents to remain at home and take precautions against fire.

The storm left a 48-inch snow fall in some sections of the city. Across the river Fort Erie had 18 inches of snow.


