Waterfront Whiffs

Foundation Work On New Cold Storage Under Way — Packer Seegay Breaks Down — Bad Weather Hampers Fishing

Foundation work is advancing on the new Prince Rupert Fishermen's Co-operative cold storage plant at Fairview Bay and it is expected that it will be available to start operation in July. Concrete foundations and wood pilings are at present being installed by the Dominion Construction Co., the

contractors. Designed to be eventually five storeys high, the 80 by 80 foot plant will begin its functions with only two storeys in use this year, expanding in the course of time. Sharp freezing capacity of the plant will be 75,000 pounds a day and its ultimate storage capacity will be about 4,000,000 pounds. W. H. Brett, Co-operative manager, says that the interior of the three upper storeys will be left unfinished this year and that completion will develop in accordance with the needs of the industry and availability of materials. Power for the freezing units will be supplied by three 80 h.p. Vivian diesel engines with a fourth engine generating light current and power for wharf winches and other equipment.

The packer Chief Seegay, skipper Ralph Green, left Thursday afternoon loaded with frozen fish for Vancouver, but experienced engine trouble in Grenville channel and had to be towed back to Prince Rupert. The Morrison brother's tug Phippen made the rescue.

Foul weather has clamped a paralyzing hand on practically all fishing during the last week and the few boats that have ventured out have not gone beyond the inner areas of Dixon Entrance. Three beam trawlers brought in small catches of flounders Thursday. The Zenardi sold 3,000 pounds to B. C. Packers and the Finella and Thelma S. sold 1,600 each to Canadian Fish & Cold Storage.

Flt. Lt. Pat Deane Has Been Injured

A spare watch, in his pocket saved Flight Lieutenant Pat Deane of Prince Rupert from what might have been very serious injury when he was struck by flak while on operations over enemy territory on February 23. His wife, the former Dorothy Flaten, has received word that he is being hospitalized in England now for injuries on his right side. He has been in the Royal Canadian Air Force since 1941, received his commission in 1942 and was instructing in Canada before going overseas eleven months ago.
