the first woman chairman of a House committee, the District of Columbia committee which, with the one in the Senate, initiates all the legislation for running the nation's capital city.

She now is chairman of the important House labor committee. She's a member of the education committee and a couple of others. She introduced the first resolution in the House for the repeal of the 18th amendment.

Easily though, her most important accomplishment and the one that gave her the greatest thrill in Congress was when she successfully steered the bitterly fought Wage and Hours bill through its complicated ramifications in committee and on the House floor. As far as the House goes, she is certainly the "mother" of that vital legislation.

Probably the best way of describing her is that most friends and intimates call her "Aunt Mary." The inclination to follow suit comes a few minutes after you have met her.

She is plain, friendly and modest. At the moment she was being paid tribute on the floor of the House, she was having lunch with the members of her office staff. She is proud of the fact that she never takes the House floor to make a personal speech.
