

## FOUR TIMES ON MONDAY

But Tuesday Most Popular Day For Balloting Since Confederation

OTTAWA, June 6 (C)—Four of the 10 Dominion elections held since 1874 have taken place on a Monday, which is the week-day chosen for the 19th general election to be held June 11.

Elections held before 1874 took more than a day to complete, the first Dominion election in 1867, for instance, taking more than six weeks for polling. Since the one-day elections started, six have been held on Tuesday, five on Thursday, four on Monday and two on Wednesday.

The 1872 election, held after British Columbia entered the Confederation, was a three-month affair. It took that long for the chief electoral officer to conduct the balloting from coast to coast.

The first one-day election was Thursday, January 22, 1874. The next was Tuesday, September 17, 1878, and Tuesday scored five more in the intervening 71 years. Friday, Saturday and Sunday never have been chosen as election days.

Days and dates of the 20 Dom-

inion elections since Confederation follow:

## TED MILLS SEES OSLO

Tells How People, Overjoyed at Norway's Liberation, Gave Welcome

Petty Officer C. E. (Ted) Mills, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. C. Mills of this city, spent V-E Day at historic Scapa Flow and a few days later sailed up the fjord to Oslo on one of the first ships to arrive at the capital of Norway following the liberation. They were taking the Crown Prince back to Norway.

"What a welcome we received!" writes Ted to his parents in describing his visit to Oslo. "Honestly it is hard to believe how people could be so overjoyed. There were so many small boats in the fjord that we had to weave around them. The people were crazy with happiness and sang 'Hi-ya, Hi-ya' which is the same as our 'Hurrah'."

"The kids all gaze at you like you were a God of some kind," continues the letter. "They pinch you and everybody wants your autograph. We started a jay-walk on the street and in a few

minutes thousands of people were milling around, others climbing trees just to have a look at us.

"All the stories you may have heard about the Germans you can believe even if they were pretty grim. I mean the stuff about pulling out people's fingernails by the roots and that sort of thing. They starved the country out of all it had in the way of foodstuffs, living like kings themselves while the civilian population had no meat at all, surviving on fish and potatoes. "If one is ashore with an arm-

guard you can walk right up to a German and, if he has not any identification card, you can strip him of everything he owns. A few collaborationists are still potting at each other. Last night while we were walking home a couple of shots rang out behind us.

"The night before last they picked up a quivering on the street—cut off all his hair right on the main street—hoisted her up so everyone could see her. Thousands of people gathered around."

Ted's letter also tells of overjoyed people gathered around a
