## Briefs From Britain

BATH, Eng., (P)—Miss Janet Kidston Law, sister of the late Prime Minister Bonar Law and aunt of Richard Law, minister of state, has died here.

LONDON, (P)—Value of agricultural and horticultural output of Great Britain during 1943-44 is estimated at £502,000,000 (about \$2,259,000,000) compared with £265,000,000 in 1938-39.

HARROW, Eng., (P)—A piece of Yorkshire pudding killed Henry Youngman, aged 71. It became wedged in his throat and caused asphyxia.

LONDON, (P)—A varied collection of British art has just been purchased for \$27,000 for an art museum in tribute to Britain's effort.

BURY, Eng., (P)—John McGurk, 70, one of the early chairmen of the Labor party and for 15 years president of the Lancashire and Cheshire Miners' Protective Federation, died. He began work as a child of 12 in the coal pits.

LONDON, (P)—Will Bishop, for many years principal male dancer in the old Empire ballets and the Gaiety Theatre in London, has died, aged 76.

LIVERPOOL, Eng., (P)—Sir Robert Ernest Kelly, C.B., F.R.C.S., consulting surgeon at Liverpool Royal Infirmary and emeritus professor of surgery at Liverpool University, has died here, aged 65.

MALDON, Sussex, Eng., (P)—Nine thousand voters will cast ballots here early in the new year to decide what type of memorial should be built in memory of Maldon men killed in the war. The 'choices': cottages for ex-servicemen, a new hall, or a cottage hospital.
