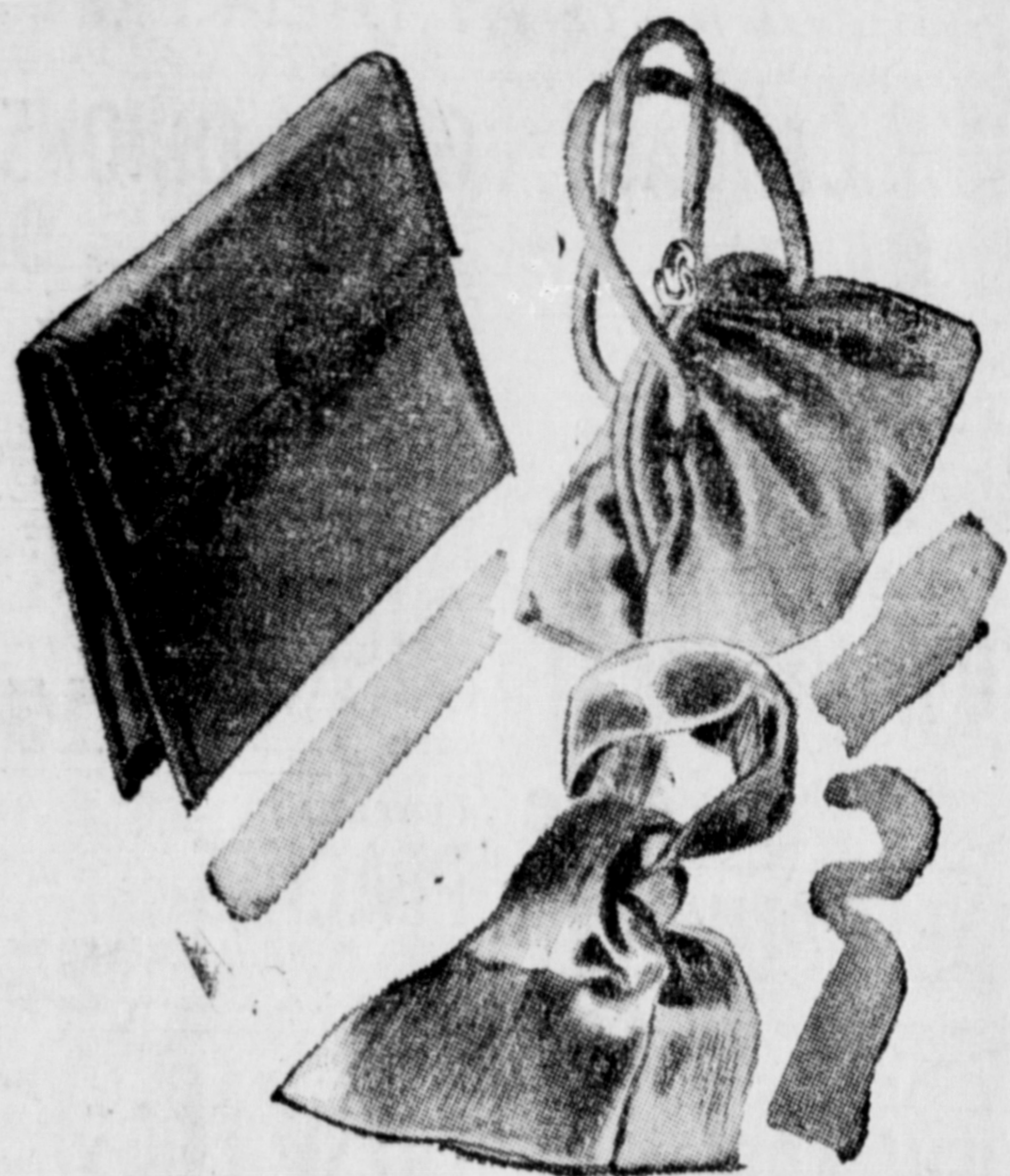

LOOKING OVER BALL LEAGUES

There was only one game featured in yesterday's Major League schedule. In the single contest, the National League's Cincinnati Reds edged out the St. Louis Cardinals 5-4.

The Red's veteran Ed Heusser posted his fifth victory of the year in winning the contest.

In the International loop, the single double-header—between Montreal and Baltimore—was postponed but the three other single contests went on as scheduled. The Syracuse Chiefs trimmed the Rochester Red Wings 9-8 while Buffalo was plunked deeper into the league cellar when the Newark Bears shal-lacked them 10-1.

Toronto's temporarily dismal Maple Leafs broke out of their current slump to shade Jersey City's Little Giants 21-1.

LAUREL-HARDY COMEDY HERE

Servant problems of today, blended with a bit of European intrigue and governments in exile, form the background for the latest Stan Laurel and Oliver Hardy comedy "Nothing But Trouble," due this Wednesday at the Capitol Theatre. The antics of the comical pair blend laughs with a little tense drama, which, however, ends in hilarity.

Comedy highlights include the mad scramble of wealthy folk in an employment agency, trying to get servants, and the near-kidnapping of Laurel and Hardy by Mary Boland, as one of the frantic servant-hunters, the ludicrous attempt of the two to be chef and butler, their cooking mishaps, their comical adventure with a lion, a hilarious corner lot football game and a usually comic climax. Intermingled with the laughs is a plot against a little exiled king, an evil uncle who tries to do away with him to usurp his throne "after the duration," and the part the comedians, who become his friends, unwittingly play in effecting the rescue.
