toms and onset, first of gonorrhea and then, syphilis. The early in Europe in 1524. stage of gonorrhea was explosive, painful and with definite symptoms. If not caught early it might well have serious complications with permanent damage. Syphilis, at the outset, was quiet, insidious and often unrecognized. First there was the sore at point of contact, then the spread through the bloodstream, the copper-colored rash over the body and later, maybe years, the affection of heart or joints or nervous system or, so often, the

The importance of submitting to medical examination so that cultures or blood tests might be made to establish diagnosis was emphasized by Dr. Kergin.

Syphilis might be completely cured if caught in time, the doctor said, but he was skeptical about the speedy, almost instant cures which one heard about. Systematic and thorough treatment was more to be relied upon. At least weeks and possibly months were required and the treatment must be persistently adhered to if it was to be successful.

Quite frankly Dr. Kergin admitted that he would not guarantee a sure cure of gonorrhea although, by the use of penicillin and the sulfa drugs, the chances are excellent. However, it was possible to definitely establish cure of syphilis.
