

Decisive events affecting the whole course of the war may well occur within the next few days. # Optimism Pays Dividends . . .


Edmonton has long been fortunate in getting good administration. from key city officials, so it is not only the influx of population and the dramatic new role of the city as metropolis on the road to Asia that accounts for the very satisfactory financial report recently given to the citizens.

For 10 straight years, the Edmonton Journal points out, the city has collected each year more than the current municipal levy. Total collections of current taxes and arrears amounted last year to 124% of the 1943 levy. It was just about the same in 1943 and 115% in 1942. Sale of land acquired through tax sales in past years is the key to this favorable situation.
