
NEW YORK SEES FIRE PICTURES

SERVICEMEN NEED PRIORITY

Claim Impossible to Get Silk Stockings on Discharge

REGINA, Dec. 10 —Discharge servicewomen, happy over the courses they can take and the gratuities they receive, have one complaint—no stockings.

Some in Regina expressed the view the clothing priority slip they received on discharge should include priority on at least one pair of silk stockings as well as the one tailored suit to which it entitled them.

One of them put it this way: "Give me my gratuities and a pair of nylons and I'd be in heaven."

Four women's hosiery departments explained to a reporter they did not recognize priority slips in the purchase of silk stockings.

Discharged servicewomen, said clerks, took their chance with others whenever stockings were on sale. One servicewoman said she found being in uniform jeopardized her chances of buying stockings. Some shops felt women in uniform didn't need silk hose.

Servicewomen, who were moved from place to place, had no chance to become "favored customers" in shops where patrons of long standing were catered to. Though they were allowed to wear silk stockings in off-duty hours and during summer, many servicewomen did not buy stockings and so had no reserve stock on which to fall back.
