APPLEWHAITE AT PREMIER

Good Gathering Hear Liberal Candidate in Portland Canal PREMIER, May 26—Edward Applewhaite, Liberal candidate for Skeena, and J. P. Hawkinson of Prince Rupert spoke at a well attended meeting at Premier. Alfred Teed was the chairman.

Mr. Applewhaite spoke of the gratitude the district felt toward Olof Hanson and of the responsibilities of a member of Parliament appealing for support on the grounds of his own ability to represent Skeena and as supporter of the Liberal government. He promised to campaign on policies, not personalities, and stated it was his wish to express and carry out the views of the people of the district. He outlined the principles of Liberalism and charged the CCF with being undemocratic and irresponsible and argued that labor unionism could not exist under a CCF type of government.

Both speakers received an attentive and enthusiastic hearing. On Wednesday Applewhaite and Hawkinson addressed a receptive audience at Port Simpson. They spoke in Stewart last night.


